Approximately 850 million people around the world do not receive enough food, meaning that 1 in 8 go to bed hungry every night. That number is even lower in the US, where the ratio is 1 in 6 for adults, 1 in 5 for children, and 1 in 3 for African-Americans and Latino's. In Berks County alone, 23,000 individuals depend on food shelters for nourishment on a monthly basis, but the only way food shelters can receive such food to give out is by contributions from the more fortunate in the community. Check with your first block teachers to see if they are participating in the World Food Day challenge; if not, you can donate in the library, counseling office or main office.
